

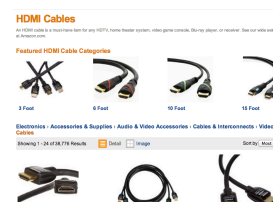
Practical Help Tip Sheet #003: iPad to TV

Tip #1: How to get your iPad screen to show on a big screen TV

There are three ways to do this:

1. Apple TV, get it at <http://www.apple.com/appletv/>
 - a. Costs \$99.
 - b. Hooks to TV with HDMI cable.
 - c. Mirrors everything on iPad, including websites, email and any app.
2. Google Chromecast, get it at <http://www.google.com/intl/en/chrome/devices/chromecast/#netflix>
 - a. Costs \$35.
 - b. Plugs directly into TV's HDMI.
 - c. Can surf web using Google Chrome's web browser
 - d. Play Netflix and YouTube
 - e. Can play Adobe Flash videos
3. Wired Dongle and HDMI cable, get it at <http://www.amazon.com>
 - a. Dongles are \$35-50.
 - b. HDMI cables are \$10 or more.
 - c. Make sure cable is long enough to reach your iPad.



Tip #2: Apple TV has tons of options

- 1) Buy HDMI cable separately.
- 2) Great solution to get rid of cable, FIOS or satellite TV service.
- 3) iPad has built in airplay - <http://www.apple.com/airplay/>
- 4) Setup is easy: this is for iOS6
 - a. On your iPad, double tap the home button to call up the app list.
 - b. Swipe to your right.
 - c. Tap the Airplay icon and select Apple TV
 - d. Select the app you want to watch



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5) For iOS 7 –

- On your iPad, swipe up from the bottom of your screen.
- Tap the Airplay icon and select Apple TV
- Select the app you want to watch



6) Use your iPhone as a remote for iOS 6 and iOS 7.

- Go to the app store and find the free app “remote” from Apple
- You will need to sync the app to iTunes the first time with your Apple id.
